This item was placed on the agenda at the request of Beer Board Member Colin Colverson. Items for discussion include, but may not be limited to, the legal background on the sale and refill of growlers, the current status of the sale and refill of growlers in

Oak Ridge, and the thoughts of the Beer Board on the sale and refill of growlers in Oak Ridge. See attached Legal Department Memorandum 14-14.

C. Oliver Springs Beer Board Recent Action – Discussion Item

This item was placed on the agenda at the request of Beer Board Member Theresa Scott. Attached is a printout from Oak Ridge Today (with advertisements redacted), posted on March 24, 2014, regarding the recent actions of the Oliver Springs Beer Board against two beer permitted establishments for selling beer to an underage person during a beer sales law compliance check. One business—Pizza Hut—was reported to have asked the Oliver Springs Beer Board for a six month revocation rather than pay \$1,250.00. Another business—Lee’s Market—was reported to have been fined \$1,250.00 and had their beer permit placed on probation for six months.

D. Wine in Retail Food Stores Legislation – Public Chapter 554 – Ability of Retail Liquor Store to Sell Beer Without a Beer Permit – Information Only

The wine in “retail food stores” legislation (Senate Bill 837, Substituted for House Bill 610) was signed by Governor Haslam on March 20, 2014 and has been assigned a public chapter number (Public Chapter 554). The legislation has three effective dates depending on the part of the legislation at issue (March 20, 2014; July 1, 2014; and July 1, 2016).

Effective July 1, 2014, retail liquor stores will be able to sell beer—subject to the restrictions set forth in Tennessee Code Annotated §57-3-806(e)—without being required to obtain a beer permit. The liquor license issued pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated §57-3-204 will be the only license required. Coincidentally with the discussion above, this legislation also specifically allows such establishments to sell growlers, whether empty or filled with beer, wine, or other alcoholic beverages. A copy of the applicable section of Public Chapter 554 is attached for your reference (Section 10, see highlighted provisions).

ROLL CALL/ATTENDANCE

Chairman Tedford called the meeting to order at 12:02 p.m. Secretary Bailey was not present during roll call; however, he arrived during approval of minutes.

ACTING SECRETARY

In the absence of Secretary Bailey, Chairman Tedford stated the Board would need to approve an acting secretary for the meeting until he arrived. Ms. Scott, seconded by Chairman Tedford, nominated Ms. Solmonson and the motion carried unanimously (6-0).

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Acting Secretary Solmonson moved, seconded by Ms. Williams, to approve the minutes of the February 10, 2014 meeting. Secretary Bailey arrived prior to the discussion and vote. With no changes to the minutes, the motion carried by a vote of 5-0 with Secretary Bailey and Mr. Colverson abstaining from the vote due to their absence at that meeting.

Chairman Tedford raised some concerns over Mr. Crosby stating he has not read the City's beer ordinances, however, he did indicate he read the manager application and agreed to the statements contained therein which are "highlights" of the ordinances. Mr. Crosby also explained the store's training process for beer sales and the ID policy. Mr. Crosby was advised by the Board to contact the police when trouble occurred if needed.

Having no further questions, Secretary Bailey moved, seconded by Mr. Colverson, to approve the manager application and the motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Jenkins was present to discuss her application. Ms. Jenkins explained their ID policy and training associated with beer sales. Having brief discussion, Mr. Colverson moved, seconded by Ms. Scott, to approve the manager application and the motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Williams was present to discuss her application. Ms. Williams was advised that she needed to make sure any replacement manager for herself received approval from the Board in a more timely manner (Ms. Williams is replacing a manager that left in 2011). Ms. Williams explained that they do not sell beer but offer a complimentary beer service a few nights a week to guests/residents. Ms. Williams explained that the guests are carded to ensure they are of age to drink beer. Aaron Wells, Director of Sales, also stated that the gentleman in the kitchen does the serving. Ms. Williams stated she felt comfortable that they did not serve anyone underage. Mr. Colverson moved, seconded by Secretary Bailey, to approve the manager application and the motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Lowe was present to discuss to his manager application. The Board commented on how quickly Mr. Lowe applied as a replacement manager. Mr. Lowe explained the training process for managers and employees regarding beer sales. Mr. Lowe also explained the computer does not allow sales of beer during non-sale hours (3 am to 6 am). Mr. Lowe was advised to ensure the blind spot area of the parking lot is monitored as well for unlawful consumption and/or hand-off of beer. Ms. Solmonson moved, seconded by Ms. Scott, to approve the manager application and the motion carried unanimously.

B. Possible Ordinance Amendment –Training Requirements

This item was brought back for the Board's consideration at the Board's request from the February 10, 2014 meeting.

Mr. Colverson expressed concerns that there was still no information on the cost/benefits from other municipalities with similar training requirements and asked whether ASAP could help the Board obtain that information. Michael Foster, ASAP, advised he would try to find some information. He also reported that the county still had 100% compliance on beer stings from the businesses with employees that had been trained.

Ms. Solmonson was concerned about the impact on the businesses and made a motion to invite the businesses to a meeting to discuss the issues. This motion was seconded by Chairman Tedford. [Note – this motion was later tabled until further information was received from ASAP.]

Ms. Scott was concerned over so many businesses that have sold beer to a minor, over-served patrons, or had patrons that come in intoxicated from other businesses.

Secretary Bailey suggested a voluntary certified vendor type of program for businesses that used an ABC certified training classes and having zero tolerance for businesses who did not undergo such training. Ms. Solmonson questioned how many have used an ABC certified training class but still fail. Ms. Solmonson and Mr. Colverson stated they are not disagreeing with the issue at hand but are trying to see if this is the most effective solution. Secretary Bailey stated the only way to have effective data is to conduct a sting operation.

Mr. Colverson had a clarification on the proposed ordinance regarding new hires that already had a certification within the last three years and the need to not have to obtain a new certification within the first thirty days of employment.

Chairman Tedford wanted to know if ASAP had communicated with the candidates for Juvenile Judge to see if they are as willing to participate in using underage persons for beer stings. Mr. Foster stated they usually use a 19 year old, which did not require Juvenile Judge approval.

Mr. Colverson moved, seconded by Secretary Bailey, to request ASAP to provide cost/benefit data associated with other municipalities that require similar training of beer permit holders for the May meeting and the motion carried unanimously.

C. Privilege Tax Payments

All privilege tax payments have been received.

D. Updated Beer Permit List

An updated beer permit list (current through February 2014) was given to the Board for reference. Ms. Dunn also stated the list is usually updated within a day or two of the meeting.

E. Manager Status at Various Establishments

Ms. Scott reported she heard Lincoln's had reorganized staff and Lisa Green (Board-approved manager) was no longer acting in that capacity. Ms. Dunn stated she would send Lincoln's a letter regarding the concern.

Chairman Tedford stated he thought the Board-approved manager at Kroger's was no longer manager. Ms. Dunn stated she would contact Kroger's as well.

ADJOURNMENT

The meeting adjourned at 12:55 p.m. upon unanimous approval.







SUBJECT: SALE OF GROWLERS

At the request of Beer Board Member Colin Colverson, an item for the April 14, 2014 agenda (Item 5.B) is a discussion of growlers including, but not limited to, the legal background on the sale and refill of growlers, the current status of the sale and refill of growlers in Oak Ridge, and the thoughts of the Beer Board on the sale and refill of growlers in Oak Ridge.

Definition


Growler is not a defined term in state law; however, it is commonly used to refer to a glass container that typically holds a half gallon of beer to go though sizing does vary. It is distinguished from bottled beer in that it is filled—and refilled—at a local beer permitted establishment such as restaurants and brewpubs.

Recent History

A few years ago, there was an opinion by the Tennessee Alcoholic Beverage Commission advising that restaurants who possessed a liquor-by-the-drink license were prohibited from the sale of draft beer for take-out unless such sale was made in a separate but contiguous location. This placed a halt on the sale of growlers by some restaurants/breweries/brewpubs. However, on May 14, 2013, Governor Haslam signed Senate Bill 747 (Public Chapter 386) into law. The new law allows beer manufacturers that are also licensed as a restaurant, or limited service restaurant for the purposes of selling alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises, to also sell beer manufactured at such brewpub for off-premises consumption. Or, in plain terms, the legislation allows such restaurants or breweries/brewpubs to resume the sale of growlers.

Sale of Growlers

To my knowledge, no beer permit holder in Oak Ridge sells growlers and there have been no inquiries from local businesses to do so. The first requirement for an establishment to sell growlers is to possess an off-premises consumption beer permit. The second requirement for an establishment to sell growlers is to close the growler in such a way as to prevent the growler from being an “open container” of beer.

Note – This memorandum is only applicable to beer as it is defined by state law and city ordinance. The sale of higher alcoholic content beer (known as high gravity beer) is regulated by the Alcoholic Beverage Commission.

The Oliver Springs City Council, acting as the city's Beer Board, handed down penalties on Thursday to two businesses that sold beer to an underage person during a beer sales law compliance check.

Representatives of the Pizza Hut on South Tri-County Boulevard asked the Beer Board to revoke their beer license for six months rather than pay a \$1,250 fine, and the Board obliged.

Lee's Market on Tri-County Boulevard was fined \$1,250 and had its beer license placed on probation for six months. It was the first offense for both businesses.

(9) Wine at retail food store license;

SECTION 6. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-3-101(a), is amended by adding the following as a new, appropriately designated subdivision thereto:

() "Retail food store wine license" means a license for the sale of wine at retail in a retail food store as defined in part 8;

SECTION 7. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-3-501(a)(1), is amended by deleting the language "located within such municipality" substituting instead the language "or upon retail food store wine licensees located within such municipality".

SECTION 8. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-3-406, is amended by deleting subsection (d) and substituting instead the following:

(d)(1) A retailer or any employee thereof shall not make or permit to be made any sales of alcoholic beverages or beer to minors. Prior to making a sale of alcoholic beverages for off-premise consumption, the adult consumer must present to the retailer or any employee of the retailer a valid, government-issued document, such as a driver's license or other form of identification deemed acceptable to the retailer that includes the photograph and birth date of the adult consumer attempting to make an alcoholic beverage purchase. Persons exempt under state law from the requirement of having a photo identification shall present identification that is acceptable to the retailer. The retailer or employee shall make a determination from the information presented whether the purchaser is an adult. In addition to the prohibition of making a sale to a minor, no sale of alcoholic beverages for off-premises consumption shall be made to a person who does not present such a document or other form of identification to the license holder or any employee of the license holder in a face-to-face transaction.

(2) A violation of subdivision (d)(1) is a Class A misdemeanor.

SECTION 9. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-3-406, is amended by adding the following as a new subsection thereto:

(i) No retail food store shall keep, or permit to be kept, upon the licensed premises any wine in any unsealed bottles or other unsealed containers except such open bottles and containers of damaged and unmarketable product retained by the retail food store for purpose of return to a wholesaler. This subsection (i) shall not apply to the premises within a retail food store that has a license under title 57, chapter 4.

SECTION 10. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 57-3-404, is amended by deleting subsection (e) and substituting instead the following:

(e)(1) No retail licensee shall operate its business involving the sale of wine, beer or other alcoholic beverages in connection with the wholesale distribution of wine, beer or other alcoholic beverage nor shall such licensee sell its wine, beer or other alcoholic beverage for purposes of resale.

(2) Notwithstanding subsection (a), beginning July 1, 2014, a retail licensee holding a license issued under § 57-3-204 shall be permitted to sell at retail beer and other malt beverages, subject to the restriction in § 57-3-806(e). No permit or license other than the license issued pursuant to § 57-3-204 shall be required for the licensed retailer to engage in such sales of beer and other malt beverages and the issuer of that license has the authority to enforce any laws related to such sales.

(3) A retail licensee shall be permitted to cash a check or other negotiable instrument for a fee when such service is made available to a person over twenty-one (21) years of age. No postdated check shall be cashed by a licensee under this section.

(4) Beginning July 1, 2014, a retail licensee shall also be permitted to sell at retail items related to or incidental to the use, consumption, dispensing or storage of alcoholic beverages, together with merchandise and supplies related to special events or parties, subject to the restriction in § 57-3-806(e). Such items may include but are not limited to:

(A) Newspapers, magazines, publications, videos and other media related to alcoholic beverages or food;

(B) Utensils and supplies related or incidental to the use, consumption, dispensing or storage of alcoholic beverages, including, without limitation, corkscrews, beverage strainers, pourers, flasks, jiggers, stirrers, wine racks, wine refrigerators, wine cellars, decanters, carafes, glassware, ice crushers, bottle openers, can openers, and devices to maximize oxidation in uncorked wine bottles and other items used in connection with the consumption, storage or dispensing of alcoholic beverages;

(C) Gift cards, packages and baskets that include alcoholic beverages and nonalcoholic items;

(D) Nonalcoholic beverages;

(E) Kegs and growlers, whether empty or filled with beer, wine or alcoholic beverages, on the licensed premises;

(F) Concentrates and ingredients used in the preparation of mixed alcoholic beverages;

(G) Beer and wine-making kits;

(H) Products and supplies related to beer and wine-making;

(I) Lemons, limes, cherries, olives and other food items used in the preparation or garnishment of alcoholic beverages or mixed alcoholic beverages;

(J) Peanuts, pretzels, chips, cheese, crackers, appetizers and other snack foods;

(K) Beverage coolers, ice chests and ice in any form;

(L) Party supplies, party decorations, gift bags, greeting cards and other items for parties and special events;

(M) Articles of clothing and accessories imprinted with advertising, logos, slogans, trademarks or messages related to alcoholic beverages;

(N) Combined packages containing multiple alcoholic beverages;

(O) Cigarettes, cigars and lighters and other smoking or tobacco related products; and

(P) Lottery tickets if the retailer's application is approved by the Tennessee education lottery corporation as provided in § 4-51-115(e).

(5) A retail licensee may sell nonalcoholic products to persons under twenty-one (21) years of age including gift cards.

SECTION 11. Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 57, Chapter 3, Part 2, is amended by adding the following as a new section thereto:

57-3-221.

(a) There is created a manager's permit to be issued by the commission to any individual who will be in actual control of the alcohol, wine or beer operations of a retailer licensed under § 57-3-204, winery involved in retail sales, or a retail food store wine licensee.

(b) An individual seeking a manager's permit shall make application for such permit by completing an application form in the manner prescribed by the commission. The individual must demonstrate that the individual meets the following requirements:

(1) Has not been convicted of any crime involving the sale or distribution of alcohol over the previous eight (8) years;
